We shall support our new editor in whatever way she feels we can. To all our previous contributors, you gave us so many ideas and great stories over 50 years - carry on the good work. Janice

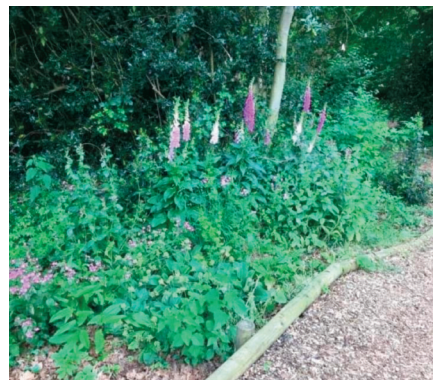

An update to the budget

On Monday 8th January, Councillors agreed a modest increase of 35p per week for Band D residents of Hatfield Peverel's share of the Council Tax, from April 2024.

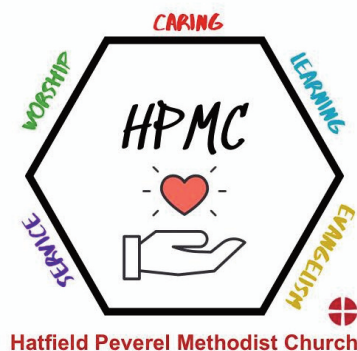
This funding will support the Council in continuing to provide and maintain the following services and facilities:

Cary-Anne Hornsey of FORAGE GROW CREATE shares her love of plants and foraging



I was always interested in plants as a child and started working with herbs that I bought as a teenager. However, when I started learning about foraging, I realised that almost everything I needed was growing wild around me for free!

Subsequently, I spent hours every day wandering the local fields, identifying plants and learning all about their medicinal and nutritional uses.

Upon looking at the “weeds” in my garden, I discovered an abundance of wild food and medicine, so decided to rewild my garden and see what grows. I now enjoy watching so many pollinators in my garden and making meals and remedies from what grows naturally there.

Friends and therapy clients started asking me to teach them what I was learning, so I started holding foraging walks locally, in the same fields where I had learnt.



Since then, I've gone on to hold workshops and day retreats all based on foraging, how to use the plants that you harvest, even the folklore surrounding them (which I'm currently writing a book about with all local pictures).

I hold Spring, Summer and Autumn foraging walks, as there are new things

to learn in every season and will be setting up some workshops soon in the village.

You can join a group foraging walk by checking the events on my [website](https://www.foragegrowcreate.co.uk/) or book a private walk for your friends and family by contacting me directly. I also offer home visits to take you on a walk around your own garden or land, to identify plants and explain how you can use them and what their edible and medicinal properties are.

This year I have decided to also add a garden consultancy service to my offerings, so that others can feed and heal their families from their gardens. This is a bespoke service looking at your family's nutritional and medicinal needs, and designing a garden that works for you in the space you have. You really don't need a lot of space to grow what you need!

MALDON FILM CLUB

– What Next?

Maldon Film Club welcomed in 2024 with the screening of three films in January: *Master Cheng*, *Close*, and *Where the Crawdads Sing*.

The season continues in March with two films the first of which, on Wednesday 13th March, is the BAFTA nominated **Decision to Leave**. This is followed two weeks later by the Oscar winning **Women Talking**.



Decision to Leave

From a mountain peak in South Korea, a man plummets to his death. Did he jump, or was he pushed?

Haunted by tons of unresolved murder cases that keep him awake at night, detective Jang Hae-Jun (Park Hae-ii) stumbles upon what seems like an accident. However, suspecting foul play, the inquisitive officer follows a faint trail of clues, trying to shed light on the mysterious death of an avid climber Ki Do-soo. Now, the deceased's cryptic wife, Seo-rae, (Tand Wei) comes under suspicion. However, something doesn't add up. Has the dark-eyed widow been toying with Hae-Jun from day one? When forbidden feelings cloud judgement, how far is Hae-Jun willing to go in the name of truth?



Women Talking

Our second film for March, on Wednesday 27th, **Women Talking**, is about the women of an isolated religious community who grapple with reconciling their reality with their faith. As the story progresses, we see a community of women coming together to figure out how they might move forward together to build a better world for themselves and their children. But with fear, religious belief, misogyny and the grave repercussions of rebellion getting in the way of a clear decision, the terrified women find themselves left with no alternative. They can stay and fight or leave. However, doing nothing is not an option! What will the women of this tight knit Mennonite colony decide to do?

The season continues until May 22nd, 2024, with all films being shown on Wednesdays until then. There are four more films to be screened in April and May including the classic **Cinema Paradiso** and the highly acclaimed **After Love**, **Living** and **Official Competition**

The cost of membership for this season has been reduced to just £25 and this entitles members to free admission to all the remaining films. In addition, there are a limited number of places for junior members aged 16-18 in full-time education and training and members' guests may attend for just £4 per person per film.

Entries are invited from members and non-members, with lots of different classes covering topics ranging from flowers, floral arrangement, cookery, handicrafts, photography and children's classes.

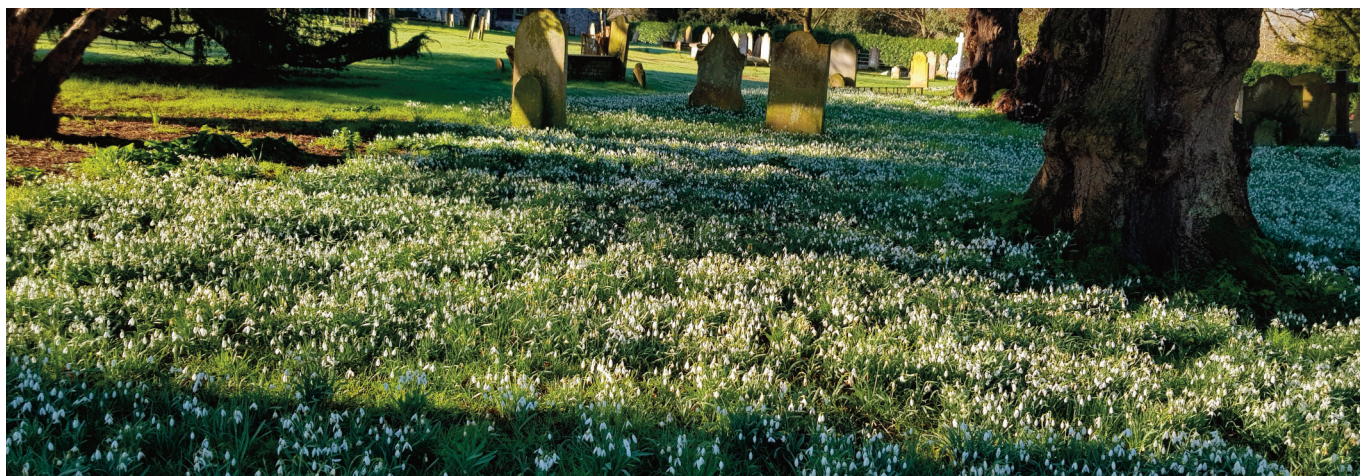

Essex Wildlife Trust's Urban Wildlife Champion project aims to reconnect people with nature, inspiring and empowering them to act for wildlife in their local area.

SIDNEY HOUSE & THE LAURELS SURGERY

An update on changes to procedures

"To maintain and if able, improve the health and wellbeing of those Patients for whom we care"



The surgery is looking to make some changes to the way we work which we would like to share with our patients:

Online Bookable Appointments

For many years now we have offered a limited number of GP appointments available for patients to book directly online. We are consistently getting feedback from our patients that when they go online at 6pm, they cannot see any appointments to book (because there was a limited amount to begin with, and they get taken very quickly). The feedback from our GPs, is often the reason for the appointment did not need a GP and would have been more appropriate to book with another colleague.

We have therefore taken the decision to withdraw GP appointments available for direct online booking. Instead, we invite our patients to go to their NHS App, or our website (www.sidneyhouseandthelaurels.nhs.uk) and submit a request for an appointment via eConsult.

eConsult

Available during our opening hours, 8am-6:30pm Monday-Friday, via our website or the NHS app. This is not for booking an appointment, but rather an alternative to contacting us by 'phone. Patients will be able to submit their query by filling out some questions and we will then contact them, on the same working day if the query is of a clinical nature, or within three working days if it is an administration query. These eConsults are handled in the same way as if the enquiry came in over the telephone and so can be more appropriately managed.

Repeat Prescription Requests

In the coming weeks we intend to withdraw email as an option for requesting repeat prescriptions. The only acceptable ways to request 'repeats' will be via online services, the NHS App, or by completing the paper repeats slip and delivering to the surgery (in our post box or via reception).

Patient feedback has shown that emails are often sent to the wrong email address, or they end up in the 'junk folder' meaning the request gets missed and delays occur. Sadly, some patients also try to use this as a route to obtain appointments or medical advice which is not appropriate, or fair to other patients.

Please speak to reception or go to our website to find out how to use online services – we would be happy to help you!

Works at the Hall

We remain busy at the hall with repairs, maintenance, and improvements. We've recently replaced the main hall lights with LED equivalents, fixing the broken and obsolete Table Tennis lights and adding light-switches so you can come into the hall and turn lights on at the door rather than find the current lighting panels in the dark. This also gives us dimmable lights for a better experience for our music and theatre shows. We expect this to reduce our electricity bills a little also. The Kitchen in the lounge has been re-fitted and the Café will shortly be offering an expanded range of food as a result. Access ramps are being added to the Lounge and Hall entrance to improve wheelchair access. We've added door-closers to the lounge inner doors to help keep the warmth inside. We're planning to have solar panels and roof insulation fitted later in the year.

Clubs and Activities at the Hall

We're pleased to announce a new children's group to the Hall – **The Allstar Majorettes** are based in Witham but will be rehearsing in the hall on the 4th Sunday morning of the month. Sadly, the Sing club on Monday mornings and the Saturday session for autistic and children with needs have closed their activities at the hall. We still have a fantastic range of activities and clubs for children, including **Hot Steps** dance; **Kazen Kai Karate**; **Tuesday Toddler Time**; **Little City**; **New Naw** children's parties, **Allstar Majorettes** and **Trainmaster**. Clubs and activities for adults include **Bingo**; **Wine Club**; **Flower Club**; **EMC Lunch club**; **Badminton Table Tennis**; **Latin Dance**; **Dog Training**; **Caledonian Dance**; **Everybody Move Bootcamp**; **Stitch to Enrich** and the **Methodist Church**. The **Coffee Lounge** is open every day from 9-5 and Sundays 10-4 and has some fantastic breakfast and lunch options as well as lovely cakes, tea, coffee, and ice creams.
