

## Hatfield Peverel Neighbourhood Development Plan Basic Conditions Statement

June 2023



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### 1. Introduction

Paragraph 8(2) of Schedule 4B to the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as applied to neighbourhood plans by section 38A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 requires a Neighbourhood Plan to meet the following basic conditions in order to progress to referendum:

- 1) the Neighbourhood Plan has regard to national policies and advice contained in quidance issued by the Secretary of State;
- 2) the making of the Neighbourhood Plan contributes to the achievement of sustainable development;
- 3) the making of the Neighbourhood Plan is in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the Local Plan;
- 4) the making of the Neighbourhood Plan does not breach, and is otherwise compatible with, EU obligations; and
- 5) prescribed conditions are met in relation to the Neighbourhood Plan and prescribed matters have been complied with in connection with proposals within the Neighbourhood Plan<sup>1</sup>.

When submitting a Neighbourhood Plan to a local authority, Regulation 15 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended) states that the Plan should be accompanied by a statement which identifies how the draft Neighbourhood Plan meets the requirements of the basic conditions listed above. This statement is referred to as a Basic Conditions Statement.

The basic conditions require a different level of assessment between national and local planning policy. In relation to national policies and advice, neighbourhood plans are only required to 'have regard' to their content, therefore referencing and relating appropriately to relevant national policy and guidance. In relation to local planning policy, neighbourhood plans are required to be 'in general conformity' with strategic policies, therefore complying, agreeing, and seeking similar outcomes as local strategic planning policies.

The Parish was designated as a Neighbourhood Area for the purposes of producing a Neighbourhood Development Plan in March 2015 and the Hatfield Peverel Neighbourhood Development Plan (HPNDP) was made in 2019. In 2021, the Parish Council started a review and update of the HPNDP. The draft updated HPNDP was published for Regulation 14 consultation on 3 March to 14 April 2023.

The HPNDP update and this Basic Conditions Statement have been informed by the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) Screening Report<sup>2</sup> produced by Place Services in January 2023.

The HPNDP and this Basic Conditions Statement have been produced in conformance with the strategic policies of the development plan for the area, including the Essex Minerals Local Plan (2014), the Essex and Southend-on-Sea Waste Local Plan (2017), and Braintree District Council's

Local Plan 2033. The Braintree District Local Plan 2033 is formed of Section 1 and 2. Section 1 of the Local Plan was adopted in February 2021 and Section 2 was adopted in July 2022.

This statement supports the submission of the update to the HPNDP. The statement will begin by clarifying which adopted and emerging local planning policies are considered to be strategic and outlining how the overarching legal requirements of a Neighbourhood Plan are met. The remaining sections of the statement will review each Neighbourhood Plan objective and policy to consider how they meet the requirements of the basic conditions.



### 2. Adopted strategic local planning policies

Part 3 of the basic conditions listed in section 1 above requires a neighbourhood plan to be 'in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the Local Plan'. Given the local planning policy context in Braintree District outlined above, this would require the HPNDP update to consider the strategic policies contained within the Braintree District Local Plan 2033.

The strategic policies in the adopted Local Plan are set out in Table 1 below.

### 3. Legal requirements of a Neighbourhood Plan

The HPNDP update has been produced by Hatfield Peverel Parish Council. The Parish Council is a qualifying body to produce a Neighbourhood Plan in accordance with Schedule 9 of the Localism Act 2011.

In 2015, and in accordance with Part 2 of the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012, BDC formally designated Hatfield Peverel Parish as a Neighbourhood Area for the purposes of producing a Neighbourhood Plan.

The draft HPNDP update contains policies relating to the development and use of land within the neighbourhood area. All policies have been prepared in accordance with the statutory requirements and processes set out in the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended by the Localism Act 2011) and the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012.

The draft updated HPNDP relates to the period 2023-2038. The NDP update seeks to provide additional protection for the NDP policies by extending the Plan period from 2033 to 2038. The draft HPNDP does not propose policies relating to mineral extraction and waste development, nationally significant infrastructure, or any other matters set out in Section 61K of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

The draft Plan relates only to the parish of Hatfield Peverel. There are no other Neighbourhood Plans in place or proposed within the neighbourhood area.



## 4. Assessment of the Neighbourhood Plan objectives

Through ongoing engagement with the local community, the Hatfield Peverel Neighbourhood Development Plan Committee identified 9 objectives to guide the production of the Neighbourhood Plan. Table 2 assesses the general themes of the identified objectives against the requirements of the basic conditions, to consider if the objectives have regard to national planning policy and advice, and conform with the identified strategic local planning policy listed in Table 1.

The policy requirements have regard to national planning policy and conform with local strategic planning policy. Under the Environment Act 2021, all planning permissions will be required to deliver at least 10% biodiversity net gain from November 2023. Non strategic local planning policy LPP52 Layout and Design of New Development supports the planting of native species in landscape proposals. The policy builds on and does not contradict national and local strategic planning policy.

### Policy HPE2 Air Pollution

#### Summary of HPNDP policy

Major development proposals with the potential or existence of air pollution must be supported by an air quality assessment using automatic measuring equipment over 12 months, and modelling of the cumulative impact of the development within and outside Hatfield Peverel and Nounsley.

Major development proposals will be not supported where WHO and Defra objectives in the Environment Bill are not achieved unless traffic movement associated with the development would not increase local air pollution levels.

Financial contributions to address harm will only be acceptable with evidence mitigation measures will avoid worsening air quality.

# 6. Compatibility with EU obligations and meeting prescribed conditions

Place Services produced a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) and Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) Screening Report<sup>3</sup> to support the production of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Regarding the SEA, the report concluded that 'the Plan does not allocate any land for development purposes and seeks to strengthen the protection and enhancement of assets at the local level and in a local context'. On this basis, an SEA was not required.

In relation to the HRA, the report concluded that the Plan'is not predicted to have Likely Significant Effect on the designated features of a Habitats site, either alone or in combination with other plans and projects'. The policies contained within the HPNDP update are therefore not likely to have significant effects on a European site (as defined in the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2012) or a European offshore marine site (as defined in the Offshore Marine Conservation (Natural Habitats, and c.) Regulations 2007) either alone or in combination with other plans or projects. On this basis, the production of a HRA was not required.

The HPNDP update therefore does not breach, and is otherwise compatible with, EU obligations. The HPNDP update meets all prescribed conditions for a Neighbourhood Plan outlined within the Neighbourhood Planning Regulations 2012 (as amended).

### 7. Conclusions

This Basic Conditions Statement demonstrates how the Hatfield Peverel Neighbourhood Development Plan update meets the requirements of the basic conditions. The objectives contained within the HPNDP update were assessed as meeting the neighbourhood plan basic conditions. All HPNDP update policies have been prepared with regard to national planning policy and are considered to be in general conformity with local strategic planning policy. All HPNDP update policies contribute towards the achievement of sustainable development. No issues have been identified regarding the compatibility of the policies with EU obligations or meeting the prescribed conditions.
