Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward



Introduction

This profile explores the demographic, social and economic characteristics of Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward and is largely based on data drawn from the 2011 Census. 2001 Census data has also been used to provide comparisons in the Ward over time for some of the characteristics. This profile is a snapshot, and is intended to support an understanding of Braintree District's Ward characteristics.

These Ward profiles represent the new Ward boundaries introduced in the Braintree District by the Electoral Commission from May 2015. This has meant that it has not been possible to directly source data from the 2011 Census for these new Wards, as they didn't exist when the Census was completed. Data for the rural Wards has been produced by adding up the Census data at a Parish level to make up the new Ward areas.

About Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward

The Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward is a predominantly rural Ward located in the South of the Braintree District and contains the Parishes of Hatfield Peverel, Terling, Fairstead, Faulkbourne and White Notley. Following the redrawing of the Ward boundaries, the original Hatfield Peverel Ward was expanded to include the Terling, Fairstead, Faulkbourne and White Notley Parishes, these previously had made up part of the Black Notley and Terling Ward.

Development Sites

The development plan sets out what, where, when, and how development will be managed in the District for the next 15 years.

Whilst the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) sets out the presumption in favour of sustainable development, planning law requires that applications for planning permission must be determined in accordance with the development plan unless material considerations indicate otherwise. The NPPF does not change the statutory status of the development plan as the starting point for decision making.

The current Braintree District development plan is made up of a number of documents, including the Local Plan Review 2005 and the Core Strategy 2011.

The maps show the allocations for homes, employment, open space etc. Proposals Map 67 covers the whole of the District and defines Inset Areas. There is an Inset map (numbers 1 to 66) for each town or village with a defined development boundary, within which development is generally acceptable subject to the policies in the Plan. Areas outside of the development boundaries are classified as countryside where development is restricted to uses appropriate to the countryside.

The Core Strategy is accompanied by the <u>LDF Proposals Map</u>, which replaces the Local Plan Review Proposals Map (67). Growth locations are shown on Insets <u>1a Land to the north-west of Braintree - off Panfield Lane</u>, <u>1b Land to the</u> <u>west of the A131 at Great Notley</u>, <u>2a Land to the north-east of Witham (in Rivenhall Parish) - off Forest Road</u>, and <u>2b</u> <u>Land to the south-west of Witham - off Hatfield Road</u>. These are set out in the Core Strategy and replace those areas of Insets 1 and 2 in the Local Plan Review which they cover.

The Pre Submission Site Allocations & Development Management Plan as amended by Further Changes (ADMP) was adopted at Full Council on 15th September 2014, as a material consideration in accordance with the Interim Planning Policy Statement. The ADMP also includes a Proposals Map and Inset Maps. The non-strategic sites and policies which are contained in the Pre Submission ADMP will be carried over into the new Local Plan unless new evidence or further changes in government policy require changes to be made.

An Annual Monitoring Report sets out the principal characteristics of the District, assesses progress in preparing Local Development Documents and monitors progress in housing, employment and other development. Please note that no assessment by officers has been carried out as to the extent or suitability of these sites for development, and no decision has been made on whether they will be allocated for development in the new Local Plan.

The Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward resident population is 4% of the total Braintree District population of 147,084 (Census 2011).

The population in Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward has decreased by -0.22% since the last Census. This is one of the few Wards in the District that has seen a fall in population when comparing the 2011 and 2001 Census data.

According to the 2011 Census, Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward has a much higher proportion of its residents who are aged 60 and over than at a District or County level. The Ward has nearly 30% of its residents who are aged over 60 compared to roughly 25% of residents in the Braintree District and Essex overall.

<u>Health</u>

Life Expectancy

There was no Census 2011 data on resident's life expectancy at a Parish level that would have enabled figures for the new rural Ward boundaries to be produced. Census 2011 life expectancy data was instead found for the whole of the Witham rural area. The Witham rural area consists of the following Parishes, Hatfield Peverel, Terling, Fairstead, White Notley, Faulkbourne and Black Notley.

There was also no data available at a County level, instead the East of England region is used as a comparison in the below table and chart.

The average life expectancy for males and females in the Witham Rural Area was lower on average than the Braintree District and the East of England region as a whole.

Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward saw a slight decrease in the proportion of people who identified themselves as "White British" by 0.9 percentage points in the 2011 Census compared to 2001. This is at a lower rate of change than the changes seen in the proportions at a District or County level.

The proportion of households in Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward that are "Pensioner households" is much higher than the proportion seen at a District level. Households living in Hatfield Peverel & Terling are also less likely to be "Lone parent families with dependent children" than at a County or District level on average.

Housing tenure

The above chart shows that according to the Census 2011 data the proportions of residents of a given tenure are broadly similar to the proportion mix overall at Braintree District and Essex wide level.

Residents in Hatfield Peverel & Terling Ward saw no real change in the proportion of residents who are "owner occupiers" over the period when compared to the Essex and the Braintree District wide levels. The Ward saw a slightly lower increase in the proportion of residents who now "privately rent"; this only increased by 1.3 percentage points in the Ward compared to around 6 percentage points in the other areas.
